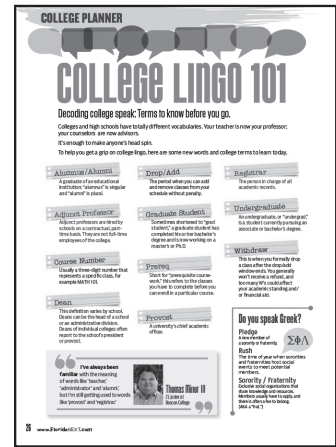

INSTRUCTIONS

- Divide class in teams of two.

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Alumnus – a graduate of an educational institution; “alumnus” is singular

Alumni – the plural form of alumnus

Drop/Add – the period of time when a student can add or remove a class from a schedule without penalty

Adjunct Professor – teachers hired on a contractual, part-time basis

Registrar – the person in charge of all academic records

RA – resident advisor usually in a dormitory to assist resident students with college life

Course Number – the number used to designate a specific class and the level of the class

Dean – usually in the administrative division of the school, this position varies from school to school, the dean of a school reports to the president and/or provost

Graduate Student – a student who has completed a bachelor’s degree and is working on a master’s degree or higher

Undergraduate – a student who is working towards an associate or bachelor’s degree, sometimes called an “undergrad”

Pre-req – classes you must enroll in and complete prior to taking additional specific courses, this is short for prerequisite

Provost – chief academic officer; usually reports to the president of a college or university

Withdraw – an action taken after the Add/Drop period where you drop a class, do not receive a refund. (These types of “drops” can eventually affect your financial aid status.)

Sorority/Fraternity – a tight group of students working towards community support goals, sometimes called a “sisterhood” or “brotherhood”

Pledge – the name given to a new member in a sorority or fraternity

Rush – a time when sororities and fraternities hold various social events and invite potential new members.

Greek Life – activities that surround a student who is a member of a sorority or fraternity
