

ACTIVITY 1

The Journey ... NOT the Destination

TEACHER TRANSCRIPT

Teacher Read aloud "The Journey, NOT the Destination" article in NEXT magazine.

Teacher (narrative) This article discusses the background and societal changes that have taken place when seniors are faced with the question, "where are you going to college?" and "what are you doing next year?". Is there a gap year in your future plans? If so, what will you do with that year? The activity today will help you investigate possibilities of a gap year. The questions asked by family and friends are important ones, but mostly important to you!

Teacher Divide class into small groups of 2 or 3 students.

Teacher Have one student from each group choose 3 of the index cards noting which topics chosen and return the cards to the basket. Do this with each group.

Teacher Display instructions:

Each group will research one activity that fits with the topics chosen from the index cards. Relate this topic to what can be experienced during a gap year.

On a large posterboard, students should display their choices for each topic along with the details of what, when, where, why, and how in a creative way.

Each group member will write a brief essay of their personal feelings about their own plans post high school graduation. This should be printed and added to the posterboard.

Teacher When complete, each group will present their choices to the class and display the posterboard on a bulletin board or around the classroom.
